1. Overview of the Institute

Following the decision of the board of the Ludwig Boltzmann Gesellschaft (LBG) to close the institute by 31 May 2013, the remaining 17 months in 2012 and 2013 were used to complete the commenced activities and in doing so to achieve the maximum benefit for the research community.

After almost eight years of manifold successful interdisciplinary research work and network activities on multi-perspective and transnational historiography of Europe in Austria in the fields of 'Communism and Post Communism' and 'Migration and Memory', the Ludwig Boltzmann Institute for European History and Public Spheres herewith presents its final report. The report depicts the recent research activities and administrative work for the period from January 2012 till May 2013.

In 2012, Thomas Lindenberger, director of the Institute (January 2009 to May 2012) returned to the ZZF (Center for Contemporary History) in Potsdam, his former research institute. Since June 2013, Christiane Hintermann and Muriel Blaive have jointly coordinated the institute. The remaining period was dedicated to organizing scientific events (conferences, the seminar series, workshops), to finish all research projects successfully (publication project on Border Communities) and finally to take care of transferring third party funded projects (Lise Meitner FWF fellowships of Machteld Venken and Patrice G. Poutrus, Elise Richter FWF fellowship of Christiane Hintermann) to new host institutions in Vienna. Both of the Lise Meitner fellows will continue their projects at the University of Vienna, Christiane Hintermann will join the Austrian Academy of Sciences.

In 2012, there was a change concerning the formation of the board. By the end of May 2012, Prof. László Szarka resigned as a board member due to the end of the cooperation with J. Selye University Komárno. Prof. Bo Petersson (Malmö University) as chairman and Prof. Ioan-Marius Bucur (Babeş-Bolyai University Cluj-Napoca) continued their membership until the institute's closure.

An important event in 2012 was the international conference *War Children in the Post-war*, organized by the FWF Lise Meitner fellow Machteld Venken in close cooperation with the German Historical Institute in Warsaw and the Polish Academy of Sciences in Vienna. on 'War Children'. He also mentioned that he would take his own ERC project 'RESOCEA' with him upon his return to the ZZF by end of May 2012. As there were some uncertainties with regard to the figures of the finance plan, it was agreed upon to fix another board meeting to decide budgetary issues.

- On 02 May 2012, the extraordinary board meeting via video conferencing took place. Thomas Lindenberger gave an overview of the financial situation and the budget of the institute for 2012/2013. After explaining the planned expenditures, all participants agreed to fix the budget.
- On 25 April 2013, the final board meeting of the LBI EHP took place. Muriel Blaive and Christiane Hintermann gave the final report regarding the scientific and financial status of the institute. It was explained that all projects had been carried out as agreed and within the financial settings. Some open questions regarding the projects that will only be completed after the closure of the institute appeared during discussion. Therefore, it was decided to obtain the final decision on financial matters by means of circular mail. The issue could be settled by mid of May 2013. Another issue was the institute library. It was agreed upon that the books should be open for the public and accessible for researchers working on similar topics. Therefore, most of the library content will be transferred to the Library of the Institute for Eastern European History at the University of Vienna.

Christina Johansson from Malmö University had to suspend the cooperation work with the LBI EHP due to job requirements at Malmö University for the first six months of 2013. In July 2013 she will continue her research activities. Due to this delay, the planned publication of the book '**Swedish Museums, Migration and Cultural Diversity**' will be postponed to summer 2014.

Since January 2012, Christina Johansson had been working as the subject coordinator of International Migration and Ethnic Relations at Malmö University. Furthermore, she was part of the examination committee of the PhD thesis 'När Islam blev svenskt' (When Islam became Swedish) by Johan Cato at Lund University.

Lavinia S. Stan

In 2012, Lavinia S. Stan continued her research of the project on Border Communities '**Fleeing Romania. Representations of Escapees at the Romanian-Yugoslav Border on the Danube during the Cold War**' by reading and analyzing archival documents photocopied from the Securitate archives in Bucharest. Moreover, she started to look into the Romanian Foreign Office Archives in Bucharest for the Romanian-Yugoslav bilateral relations during the Cold War.

In June-August 2012, Lavinia S. Stan carried out fieldwork on the Romanian-Yugoslav border and recorded interviews. She organized two distinctive sessions on the field involving two teams of three people: Cristian Bota (cameraman), Nicolae Cristea (doctoral student) and Mihai Berti (doctoral student). They went to each village on the border (Svinita, Liubcova, Cozla, Berzasca, Pescari (Coronini), Moldova Veche, Macesti, Divici, Belobresca, Pojejna, Socol) and approached the oldest people in the community and then they received recommendation to interview other elders. Every day, the team had team meetings to discuss what was done on the previous day and what was expected to be done the next day, according to their initial planning. Altogether, the team carried out 23 interviews.

From September 2012 onwards the interviews were

transcribed and edited for publication. The publication of the research results is to be expected in February 2014.

Christiane Hintermann

- The main work on the project 'Lieux de mémoire of migration in urban spaces' was divided between empirical work on the one hand and conceptual and theoretical work on the other hand.

The empirical work comprised the following tasks:

Empirical work

- ◆ An e-mail survey was conducted among almost 300 experts in Vienna in order to trace sites of remembrance of migration in Vienna. Experts from different fields were approached: museums, Vienna city administration, politics, research, migrant organizations and other NGOs working in the field. Apart from the survey a number of personal interviews on the same topic were carried out.
- ◆ A categorization and first analysis of the results was achieved.
- ◆ One of the case studies in the project is the Marcus Omofuma Stone (history, meanings, and conflicts). In this connection another five expert interviews were done.

the topic. The third main aim of the project is to offer an innovative methodological contribution to the research on textbooks.

- Between January and March 2012, Christa Markom and Heidemarie Weinhäupl (with the help of Melanie Schiller) prepared and conducted twelve workshops in four classes in three schools in Salzburg. The workshops were recorded via audio and video documentation. In January 2012, the team also worked on the written documentation and reflection of the data from the workshops held in Vienna from October to December 2011. In February and March 2012, additionally the documentation of the workshops from Salzburg was processed. Regarding the analysis of the textbooks, an internal workshop on the methods applied was held. While the analysis of textbooks was continued, the team also worked on two progress reports, one for the Scientific Advisory Board, another for the Sparkling Science administration.
- After conducting the last workshops in schools in March 2012 and the school-presentations in Vienna (March) and Salzburg (April), the team completed the documentation of the 24 workshop days and started with preparations for the analysis of the acquired data.
- After a project break (Christa Markom was on maternity leave from March to September 2012 and Heidemarie Weinhäupl was on educational leave from July to September 2012), the team together with Sanda Üllen (a new team member) started the final analysis of selected textbooks by using content analysis in combination with critical discourse analysis. The second half of 2012 and the first months of 2013 were also dedicated to the analysis of the comprehensive material generated in the course of the workshops with pupils. Moreover, results of the workshop analysis were integrated and compared with the findings of the textbook analysis. At this time also the documentation and analysis of an online survey regarding the opinions of teachers on textbooks and migration (n=2,700) took place.
- Furthermore, until February 2013 didactic material regarding the topics of migration, diversity and multilingualism was written up. During a workshop in March 2013, the didactic material was discussed with project partners from schools and didactics and then prepared for publication on educational platforms (e.g. www.schule.at) and in selected journals.
